

There are 11 four-year Vermont colleges with 500 or more fulltime undergraduates according to the Integrated Post-secondary Education Data System. Approximately 41 percent of students attend one of the six private Vermont colleges while 59 percent of students attend one of the five state institutions.

The private Vermont colleges have an average four-year graduation rate of 57.7% and the public universities have an average five-year graduation rate of 45%. Six Vermont Colleges meet the <u>DIY College Rankings 50-50 profile</u> requirements.

The average <u>SAT score</u> for college-bound seniors in Vermont was 522 for Critical Reading and 525 for Math. The 75th percentile scores were 600 for Critical Reading and 600 for Math. Of the schools that reported SAT scores, four colleges had 75th percentile scores equal to or higher than the state in both categories.
