According to IPEDS, there are 69 Florida colleges with 500 or more full-time undergraduates. These include 22 institutions that grant some four-year bachelor degrees but are primarily community colleges. Of the 441,778 students, almost 78.9% attend the 36 public institutions in the state compared to the 21.1% at Florida's 33 private colleges.

The average four-year [graduation rate](#) for private Florida colleges is 34.1% and the five-year rate for public-institutions with available information is 49.7%. A total of 11 schools meet the [DIY College Rankings 50-50 profile](#) requirements.

College-bound seniors in Florida had an average of 19.6 [ACT](#) Composite score with a 18.7 for English and 19.5 for Math. The 75th Percentile scores were a Composite of 23, 23 for English, and 23 for Math. A total of 29 colleges ACT 75th% Composite scores were at or above this level.
