

There are 10 four-year Montana colleges with 500 or more fulltime undergraduates according to the Integrated Post-secondary Education Data System. Approximately 12 percent of students attend one of the four private Montana colleges while 88 percent of students attend one of the six state institutions.

The private Montana colleges have an average four-year graduation rate of 29.5% and the public universities have an average five-year graduation rate of 35.2%. One school meets the DIY College Rankings 50-50 profile requirements.

College-bound seniors in Montana had an average of 20.5 <u>ACT</u> <u>Composite score</u> with a 19.3 for English and 20.5 for Math. The 75th Percentile scores were a Composite of 25, 23 for English, and 24 for Math. Of the schools reported scores, a total of five colleges ACT 75th% Composite scores were at or above this level.
